

Throughout its 160 years, the B&O Railroad enjoyed a rich and varied corporate life. It survived to become one of the world's oldest railroad companies through a combination of skill, foresight, and chance—along the way acquired a secure place in the cultural and economic history of the United States.

The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Historical Society exists to help assemble, interpret, and share that history. The B&SO, like railroading everywhere, touched virtually all areas of American life. This diversity is reflected in the Society: members' interest range from motive power and railroad architecture to modeling and artifact collecting. Most importantly, the Society provides a forum for the exchange of information and news, the publication of original research, and for members to simply get to know each other. The fellowship of common interest and the opportunities for mutual assistance are two of the Society's greatest assets.

The B&SORRHS is an independent non-profit educational corporation recognized by the CSX Corporation. Its membership is spread throughout the United States and numerous foreign countries, and its scope includes all facets of the B&SO's history. The Society's purpose is to foster interest, research and publication concerning the B&SO. Several classes of memberships are available: regular yearly; sustaining, non-USA, associate (corporate/business) and institutional.

The nominal yearly dues make it all possible. Members receive a variety of publications offering news, comments, technical information, and in-depth coverage of the B&SO and its related companies. Occasional publications include monographs, calendars, rosters, and reprints of B&SO source material. Their purpose is to make otherwise unobtainable data available to the membership at reasonable cost.

Through the Society, members may participate in various field trips, research projects, equipment restorations, and locally sponsored get-togethers, such as the annual Eastern and Western mini-conventions. Also, each year the B&SORRHS holds an Annual Convention, with facility tours, workshops, photo shows, displays, and the Annual Membership Meeting and Banquet. It is only one of the opportunities members have each year for meeting each other—and it is usually an extraordinary event.


